\$9,000,000 FOR OHIO RIVER
Lock and Dam Work and Channel Improvement \$5,684,000.

Washington, December 16.—The new rivers and harbors bill completed today appropriates \$5,684,000 for the Ohio river and as the sundry civil bill will carry \$3,200,000 more, there will be \$8,884,000 available for the improvement of the river. The committee provides \$5,000,000 to continue the work on locks and dams, and \$684,000 for general open channel improvement. It is estimated the total amount in the rivers and harbors bill will approach \$56,000,000.

GIVEN \$12,500 DAMAGES FOR TERRIBLE INJURY.

For injuries received when an iron bar penetrated his abdomen while under a turn table at the round house, a jury in Kenton Circuit, Judge F. M. Tracy's court, awarded George Kornhoff a verdict for \$12,500 against the C. & O. railroad. The suit was for \$50,000.

COLD STOPPING STOCK DISEASE.

The continued cold weather is proving to be the strongest ally of the government in the fight against foot and mouth disease, according to inspectors.

WHOLESALE MURDER IN MEXICO

Washington, December 16.—One hundred and fifty Mexicans, many of them once prominent officials, have been secretly executed in Mexico City within the last few days.

GERMAN ANIMAL CENSUS.

Germany's animal census shows that the number of beef cattle, calves and sheep has decreased since 1907, the decrease in sheep amounting to 25 percent.

ENGLAND

Attacked By German Fleet—18 Killed and Tight Little Isle Is Shaken Up

18 Killed.
London, December 16.—A dispatch from Scarborough passed by the London censors says that 18 people were killed at Scarborough today by the bombardment of German warships.

London, December 16.—A German fleet made a sudden dash into the North sea today, shelled Scarborough and Hartlepool, Whitby and Red Car, English coast towns on the North sea, and engaged certain units of the British fleet.

Several people were killed and many buildings damaged.

Four German cruisers appeared off Scarborough at an early hour and began to bombard the town.

It is apparent that they had no difficulty in dropping shells into the city.

Panic seized the people and many of them fled from their homes.

The residents of Hartlepool were aroused from their sleep by the sound of a heavy gun firing.

They flocked to the streets and then made their way to the beach to learn what was going on.

In a few moments shells from German cruisers began dropping into Hartlepool, whereupon the crowd along the shore broke for shelter.

Panic also showed itself at this point. Fear took possession of the people and many of them abandoned their homes and fled inland.

200 Miles From London.

The news of this naval raid was announced by the British admiralty shortly before 11:30 o'clock this morning and threw London into the greatest state of excitement that has prevailed since the outbreak of the war.

Asserts Kaiser Has Diphtheria.

Paris, December 16.—A Madrid dispatch, published in the Journal, says: "Reliable news received here says that Emperor William's condition, although recorded by the bulletins as improved, is giving great anxiety. His doctors speak of a serious sore throat following diphtheria, which the emperor contracted during a visit to the eastern front."

Two German Cruisers Reported To Be Sunk.

London, December 16.—Reports are current in London that two German cruisers have been sunk in the North sea.

144,000 Men Lost By the Belgians?

Berlin, December 16.—The newspaper Figaro of Paris reports that the Belgian troops are suffering from typhoid, dysentery and cholera. Their casualties since the commencement of the war have been 25,000 killed, 52,000 wounded, 35,000 captured and now prisoners in Germany and 32,000 interred in Holland.

The Commission for Relief in Belgium announced that it would henceforth pursue a country-wide policy of assigning ships to each state of the Union asking for them.

A national leprosyarium, under the control of the Public Health Service, was recommended to the House Commerce Committee by Surgeon General Blue.

In response to a request from Brig Gen. Bliss at Naco, Ariz., Secretary Garrison ordered additional infantry and artillery sent to the Mexican border.

Representative Morrison of Indiana, introduced a resolution in the House proposing a national prohibition amendment to the Constitution.

Representative Langley has two good roads bills for the improvement of Kentucky highways that he will introduce in Congress shortly.

A Women's Political Union committee called upon Secretary of State Bryan "to present a constructive plan to prevent war."

The Canadian steamer Sharon, loaded with coal for England, a month overdue, is believed to have struck a mine and gone down.

Strengthening of the volunteer force of the United States through college camps was urged by General Leonard Wood.

Several suits, including one in the Federal court, were filed against the Arizona prohibition law.
