Bounties to Soldiers of 1861 and 1862. Passed March 2, 1866, by unanimous consent of the House of Representatives in Congress.

Resolved, That the Committee on Military Affairs be instructed to inquire into the propriety of providing by law that soldiers who enlisted in 1861 and 1862, and served more than one year, and were discharged in consequence of disease contracted in the service, shall receive the Government bounty to which they would have been entitled had they served two years.

All soldiers so discharged should immediately send their discharges for collection of said bounty to me, and I will get their money for them as soon as the same can be obtained by any other person.
