With brief exercises the new parsonage of Grace Methodist Episcopal Church, 216 State street, erected as a memorial to the ladies of the church, was opened Thursday afternon.

The building, which cost \$11,900 to erect and \$1,700 to fornish, is among the largest and most completely equipped in the State. It is four floors high and is made of pressed brick with Indiana limestone trimmings. Inside it has hardwood floors and all the latest improvements.

"It is the most beautiful parsonage I have ever been in or seen," said Dr. Fox this morning.
Following the service, during which several hymns were sung and an appropriate address made by Dr. Fox. a "house warming" was held from 4 until \$6 o'clock.

As a testimony of their devotion the board of trustees has placed a bronze teblet containing the following inscription in the parsonage:

"This parsonage is designed as a memorial to the Ladies' Saving Society, 1872 to 1897, and the Ladies' Aid Society, 1872 to 1897, in testimony of their devotion and sacrifices during the erection of Grace Methodist Episcopal Church."


