At least twenty-five tanks will be assigned to Pennsylvania's new National Guard for the equipment of the new tank battallon which is to be a part of the Guard. Those to receive general increases include assistant postmasters, clerks and carriers at first and second class post offices, railway mail clerks, inspectors, mechanics, laborers, watchmen and third class postmasters.

The \$200 increase would go to those now receiving between \$1,000 and \$1,200; \$150 to those between \$1,200 and \$1,200; \$150 to those between 1,600 and \$2,000, and \$100 to those receiving \$2,000 to \$2,500. Carriers in village delivery service would receive an advance of twenty per cent and rural carriers would get increases of from \$37,50 to \$200, according to length of their routes and frequency of trips. Substitute clerks and carriers would be given sixty cents an hour.
