DUN'S WEEKLY REVIEW OF TRADE

Further Abatement of Financial Tension—Business Restricted to Needs

New York, September 4.—Dun's review tomorrow will say:

"There is further abatement of financial tension, although money continues firm and new business is restricted to urgent needs. The disorganization of foreign exchange is less marked, international banking arrangements slowly improving. Efforts to restore more normal transportation facilities with foreign markets are meeting with success. Shipments of grain abroad are becoming more extensive and buying for foreign account continues heavy.

"The higher prices induced by these purchases cause a considerable expansion in offerings of wheat from the country, and these sales abroad will hasten a return to more normal conditions in international exchange.

Considerable irregularity is manifest in reports from the leading mercantile and industrial centers, but in view of existing conditions, the movement of commodities is quite well maintained.

"Failures for the week in the United States were 364, compared with 293 last year; in Canada 55, compared with 159 last year."

DAVID J. PALMER HEAD OF G. A. R.

Detroit, Mich., September 4.—David J. Palmer of Washington, Ia., today was elected commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, at the closing session of the forty-eighth national encampment. Washington, D. C. was chosen for the 1915 encampment.

Other elected officers were: Senior vice commander-in-chief, J. R. Griswold, of Grand Rapids; junior vice commander-in-chief, F. W. Connors of Dallas, Tex.

A committee of past commanders-in-chief was appointed today to frame a congressional bill providing for the recognition of all veterans of the war between the states in public employment, irrespective of their age, a resolution adopted unanimously, opposed any change in the national flag.
