- 1. No letter must exceed one page of a letter sheet, or relate to any other than purely domestic matters. 2. Every letter must be signed with the writer's name in full. 3. All letters must be sent with five cents postage enclosed...

Equivalent rules will be applied by Gen. Winder, to all letters sent from the South to Fortress Monroe, for parties in the United States.
