Expressions of sorrow and regret were general all over the city when the sudden death of Mr. John Wesley Hall was learned. Mr. Hall was esteemed by all who knew him, and those who knew h m best loved him as a man of integrity and honor. He was in good health, apparently, at 1 o'clock Monday night. At that time he was in conversation with a Times-Dispatch man and Alderman Patram, while standing on Hull Street, near Eleventh, and talked pleasantly and interestingly on the payment of the capitation taxes. He died at 1:15 A. M. Tuesday at his home at Twelfth and Bainbridge Streets, after only a few moments' illness, in the presence of his devoted son. Just before his death he sat at a table writing. His son was in bed in the same roubed his hands and said in a strange voice: "believe I am losing my senses. Clinton, is that you?"

The son put his father to bed and called Dr. Rucker and Dr. Mathews. Everything was done for him, but he died in a few minutes.

The funeral will be from Bainbridge Street Church this afternoon at 3 o'clock, and the burial will be in Maury Cemetery.

Mr. Hall was born in Manchester August 2, 1823. He was educated in the public schools of Manchester. In the early part of his life he engaged in the commission business with Johns R. Joter. He was also in business with Charles H. McMurdo. He became a member of the Manchester Artillery at the outbreak of the war, and was a prisoner at Fort Delaware for one year. He was book-keeper for G. H. Murden for two years, and was with John R. Jeter in Richmond for ten years. Mr. Hall was also associated in business with Chamblin and Leigh. Later he was in business with Egbert G. Leigh, Jr., and Company. After that firm d.s-solved partnership he went to work for the Union Brokerage Company, of Richmond.

In January, 1895, he was elected to succeed J. V. Vaden as City Auditor of Manchester, Mr. Vaden having died while holding that position.

Mr. Hall married Miss Pattio E. Talley, of Manchester, September 25, 1867. The ceremony was performed in the Bainbridge Street Baptist Church by the Rev. Dr. J. L. urrows. Mrs. Hall was the adopted daughter of Mrs. Thirza Hatcher Blankingship. The wife died May 20, 1894.




