

County Board Proceedings

Eagle River, Wisconsin.
July 12, 1921.

County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to adjournment. Meeting called to order by Chairman Saltenberger. Roll call by clerk, all members present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Ordinance No. 1.

Detaching certain territory from the town of Farmington, in Vilas County, Wisconsin, and attaching the same to the town of Cloverland.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Vilas do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following described territory, being a part of the Town of Farmington, in Vilas County, Wisconsin, to-wit: All of Section No. One (1) in Township number Forty (40) North, of Range number Nine (9) East, is hereby detached from the Town of Farmington and is attached to and made a part of the Town of Cloverland.

Section 2. It is hereby ordered that the Town Boards of the Town of Farmington and of the Town of Cloverland shall meet in joint session at the Town Hall in the Village of Eagle River, in Vilas County, Wisconsin, on the 15th day of July, 1921, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon of said day and apportion and pro-rate the credits and the liabilities of said Towns between the Town of Farmington and the Town of Cloverland as provided by law.

Section 3. The County Clerk shall, immediately after the passage of the Ordinance, cause a plat and record thereof to be made specifying the names and boundaries of the Towns affected by this Ordinance and as changed thereby, which plat and record shall be kept in the office of such Clerk as provided by law.

The County Clerk shall immediately cause this ordinance to be published in one or more of the newspapers published in this county; and such Clerk shall procure and distribute copies of such newspapers to the several Town Clerks who shall file the same in their respective offices. The County Clerk shall send to the Secretary of State a certified copy of the ordinance.

The County Clerk shall furnish to the Assessor of Incomes a copy of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Vilas County, Wisconsin.

Gentlemen:

The Petition of the undersigned Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Flambeau, respectfully represents that on the 24th day of April, 1921, at the regular annual Town Meeting of said Town, the electors thereof voted to construct a bridge lying wholly within said town of Flambeau, over and across Spring Creek in Section thirty (30) of Township Forty (40) North of Range Five (5) East, that at the time due provision was made for the payment by said Town of Flambeau of the proportion of the cost of constructing of such bridge required by law to be paid by the Town, to-wit: By the paying of a tax and appropriating the same for the purpose of constructing such bridge in one-half of the estimated cost of \$500.00, to-wit: In the sum of \$250.00; and further that the total valuation of the Town of Flambeau for the year 1920, as equalized by the County Board was \$282,492.00, being less than \$500,000.00, and that the cost of constructing such bridge will be in excess of one-tenth of 1 percent of the assessed valuation of the Town of Flambeau as fixed and equalized by the County Board at the last preceding year.

WHEREFORE your petitioners pray that an appropriation be made by the said County of Vilas aid in the construction of such bridge, as provided by law. (Section 1319 Statutes).

Resolution No. 1 offered by Supervisor Wm. Selves.

WHEREAS the Town of Flambeau has voted to build and to construct a Bridge over and across Spring Creek in Section 30 Township 40 Range 5 East, in said Town of Flambeau, at an estimated cost of Nine Hundred Dollars, and has provided by a tax levy sufficient funds to provide for the payment of it's one-half share of the cost of said bridge, to-wit: of the sum of Four Hundred fifty (\$450.00) Dollars; and has petitioned this Board and asked that Vilas County make a levy and an appropriation of the sum of Four Hundred Fifty (\$450.00) Dollars to provide for the County's one-half share of the cost of constructing said bridge.

Now therefore be it resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Vilas County, that there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of Vilas County a tax sufficient to take care of it's one-half share, or the sum of Four Hundred Fifty (\$450.00) Dollars and the same is hereby appropriated to pay for the build- of said bridge, or so much thereof as may be necessary and required for that purpose.

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Vilas County: Gentlemen:

Whereas, pursuant to the provision of paragraph 2 of Section 1317m-4 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 1919, the qualified electors of the Town of Plum Lake at a special town meeting held on the 27th day of June, 1921, duly levied a special tax for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars for the purpose of improving by surfacing and graveling that portion of the county highway running between Sayner and Star Lake,

Now therefore the Town of Plum Lake respectfully petition that your body levy and appropriate under the terms of Para. 2 of Section 1317m-4, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars as county aid to be placed in a fund to be used in the improving by surfacing with gravel that portion of said County Highway.

Resolved that there be levied on all of the taxable property of Vilas County the sum of Five Hundred Dollars and for the purpose of producing a fund composed of said \$500.00 and a like sum of \$500.00 heretofore levied and appropriated by the Town of Plum Lake for the purpose of improving by surfacing with gravel that portion of the County Highway running between Sayner and Star Lake so far as said combined fund together with such other moneys as there may have been heretofore appropriated for said purpose will do the work; and that the said fund be expended and the said work be performed according to and under the provisions of Section 1317m-4 of

the Wisconsin Statutes.

Resolution No. 3.

Whereas the County Agricultural Agent has appeared before this Board and has represented to the Board that he can buy the material and build two silo forms, one to be used in erecting a ten foot silo and one to be used in erecting a 12 foot silo at a cost of around \$120.00, and

Whereas it is belived to be to the best interests of the residents of Vilas County that such silo forms should be bought and paid for by the county and then rented out to such persons as wish to use them at the rate of \$1.00 for each 3 feet in height of the silo to be built,

Now therefore be it resolved that the county agricultural representative be and he is hereby authorized to get the material and cause to be built two sets of silo forms, one set for a ten foot silo and one set for a 12 foot silo; and that when such forms are ready for use the county agricultural agent is hereby authorized to rent such forms out to the farmers of Vilas county to be used in the erection of silos in this county and to charge for and collect for the use of such forms and at the rate of \$1.00 for each three feet in height of the silo built; and the expense of moving such forms from the county agricultural representative's place of storage and of returning them to such place shall be paid for by the person using such forms; and that such agricultural representative notify any persons wishing to use such forms that they will be held responsible for any damage, other than ordinary wear and tear, which may happen to such forms while in the possession of such person.

And the agricultural agent is hereby directed to keep a record of such forms and report to this board from time to time.

Whereas the Attorney General did on the 18th day of May, 1921, duly certify to the legality of the county highway and bridge bonds issued under date of May 1st, 1920, and,

Whereas the Hackley-Phelps-Bonnell Co. and the Turtle Lake Lumber Co. agreed in writing each to take at par Five Thousand Dollars of such bonds when so certified but to date has failed to do so,

Now therefore be it resolved that the county treasurer is hereby directed to deposit Four Thousand Dollars of such bonds in the Farmers & Merchant's State Bank of Eagle River and draw his draft against the Hackley-Phelps-Bonnell Co. for the Four Thousand Dollars and accrued interest; and that he also deposit another Four Thousand Dollars of such bonds in the same bank and draw his draft against the Turtle Lake Lumber Co. for Four Thousand Dollars and accrued interest on said bonds; and that he notify each of said Companies of his action and demand that they take up such bonds as they have agreed to do.
