The Oconeechee Farm.

CHAPEL HILL, N. C., Jan. 26

To the Editor of the News and Observer:

There are three things that kindle Carolina enthusiasm in me. These are (1) modern education, (2) thoroughbred stock intelligently handled, (3) factories.

Sometime ago I wrote of the thoroughbred Jersey cows at the Rockwell Park Farm. Mr. Hamsley writes now that the herd is doing splendid work. He says: "Tomella has brought me a full sister to your bull that \$400 would not buy. She is milking 36 to 38 pounds a day and making 17 pounds of butter a week." This is a great cow. She has the blood of Tormentor, Oonan, Soomassie, Kathletta and Ida of St. Lambert. And there is nothing better. I am proud of this Carolina cow.

But I write now of another stock farm, the Oconeechee. Everybody knows that this is the farm of Col. J. S. Carr. I spent a holiday looking it over, and if anyone reading this letter has an eye for stock, and can get a holiday, let me suggest that you spend it on the Oconeechee farm at Hillsboro.

There is a large barn for horses and a larger barn for the Jersey cows. Professor Irby, of the Agricultural and Mechanical College, designed the latter. I have never seen a barn equal to it. There is comfort, convenience and absolutely no waste of anything.

There are more than fifty standard-bred horses on this farm. Three of these are daughters of Pamlico. There is a son of Kremlin, and he cost Mr. Carr over \$500 before he was foaled. There are Kentucky bred and Carolina bred horses, "fine as split silk," they say at the farm, and I suppose they are right.

The Jerseys came next. There are about thirty of them; "Meridale Butler" heads the herd. He has the blood of Matilda 4th. This was a great cow. She gave 16,153 gallons of milk in one year. Col. Carr prefers Maryland to Tennessee Jerseys. The sheep are the largest I have seen. There is a large flock of Shropshire and a small flock of Dorset.

The hogs are black Essex and red Jersey.

Poultry is a specialty here. There are nine breeds of chickens, two of turkeys and two of ducks. Think of a turkey that will weigh 37 pounds, and a chicken hen weighing 8 pounds, taking the prize in the New York poultry show, and costing twenty dollars. I am not writing to advertise the Oconeechee farm. I am writing because I believe in scientific farming and thoroughbred stock. There is money for our people in good stock, especially the Jersey cow, and such an effort as Col. Carr is making is a fine object lesson. It is educating, and I would be glad if a thousand farmers could see it, study it carefully and go home and do likewise.
