

HOKE SMITH IS AFTER SETTLERS

GEORGIA'S GOVERNOR INDUCING EMIGRATION TO SOUTH.

He Has Been Campaigning in Leading European Countries and Says He Has Removed Prejudices Against Southern States.

London, May 1.—After a tour of the continent, during which visits were made to Hamburg, Bremen, Vienna and other places, with the object of inducing emigration to Georgia, Gov. Hoke Smith and party are making a brief sojourn here. Governor Smith said today that his trip has been successful and that he has removed some of the prejudices against the southern states. He said he has been promised that several ships will sail direct to Savannah and that others would make Savannah a port of call. Some good work had been done in Scotland, whence the stream of emigration to Georgia already had started.

Governor Smith said it was his intention to appoint agents at Hamburg, Bremen, Vienna, Prague, Glasgow and other ports. The governor and his party will sail for New York tomorrow.

Baptist Editor Stricken.
Parkersburg, W. Va., May 1.—Rev. J. D. Simmons of this city, editor of The Baptist Banner, who was stricken with apoplexy Sunday, died today.

THE LAW FAVORS LABOR UNIONS

RAILROADS CANNOT DISCRIMINATE AGAINST MEMBERS

Master Mechanic of Louisville Road Fined \$100 for Threatening to Discharge Locomotive Engineer Because He Belonged to Labor Organization.

Washington, May 1.—The constitutionality of the act of congress of June 1, 1898, prohibiting railroads engaged in interstate commerce from discriminating against members of labor organizations in the matters of employment is called into question by the case of William Adair vs the United States.

The case came from the United States court for the eastern district of Kentucky. Adair is the master mechanic of the Louisville & Nashville railroad and he was proceeded against on the charge of threatening to discharge a locomotive engineer because the latter was a member of the Order of Locomotive Firemen. The law, which resulted from the Chicago strikes of several years ago, was invoked and the district court fined Adair \$100. The case cannot be heard before October.

Sued for Overdrafts.
New York, May 1.—Sheriff Hayes has received an attachment for \$295.65 against the property of Thomas H. Hodgins, a resident of Butte, Mont., in favor of the State Savings bank of Butte, to recover moneys which it is alleged Hodgins as cashier for the bank allowed various corporations and parties to overdraw between 1900 and 1905.

Falls in Burglar Trap.

Cleveland, May 1.—Mrs. Mary Sharpe showed she would be a clever sleuth when she returned to her home here early last night and found two burglars fast asleep in her bed. To insure their capture she procured a bottle of chloroform, put them further into slumberland than nature could have done, and then started for the telephone to summon the police. She became faint after drugging the burglars and dropped in a bed in another room. She fell asleep and when she awoke learned that the burglars had vanished with much booty.
