

Kaiser Has Severe Cold; Was In Rain Before Verdun

London, Sept. 25.—Emperor William is suffering from a severe cold, according to the Geneva correspondent of The Chronicle. William caught it in the trenches before Verdun where he was drenched by rain recently while reviewing soldiers...

Aside from the usual official announcements there is little news of vital importance received from the "Battle of Giants" thus far today. Weather conditions in the main are responsible for a lull in the war areas...

The thirteenth day of the great battle of the Aisne found the Franco-British and German armies still fighting desperately, with the Germans fiercely resisting the gradual advance of the allies on General Von Kluck's flank...

The German army headquarters' report regarding the situation in France, confines itself to saying that there have been some minor engagements, but nothing of importance has transpired...

The sharpening of censorship over the news passing through the hands of the British authorities, as announced last night, will be put into effect, was apparent to a marked degree today.
