An analysis of the capsules revealed that they contained the same type of poison from which Miner died and which Mrs. Miner admits she took in an attempt at suicide, because, she said, "I wanted to be with Ed."

Mrs. Miner yesterday attempted to cast the blame for her husband's death on Hartwig although she at first maintained he committed sui-cide. She told Paul that the farmer, who is alleged to have paid many attentions to her, was in a position to have placed the poisoned capsules in a box of pills which had been pre-scribed for Miner by his physician.
