

Notice of Condemnation.
In the United States Court for the Southern Judicial District, sitting at Ada, Indian Territory.

In the matter of the application of the Texas and Oklahoma Railroad company for the appointment of referees to determine and appraise all compensation and damages to be paid for land, property and improvements to be appropriated and condemned for right-of-way and station grounds, in the Chickasaw Nation, Indian Territory.

To the Chickasaw Nation and Palmer S. Mosley, governor of said nation or tribe of Indians, and the Choctaw Nation and Green McCurtain, principal chief of said nation or tribe of Indians:

You and each of you are hereby notified that the undersigned were appointed by the Honorable Hosea Townsend, Judge of the U. S. court for the Southern Judicial district of the Indian Territory, on the 2d day of July, A. D. 1903, to act as referees to appraise and determine all compensation and damages, which shall be paid to you by reason of the taking and appropriation by the Texas and Oklahoma Railroad company of lands, property and improvements for right-of-way, station grounds, switches, side-tracks, turn-outs and other railroad purposes necessary for the construction, operation and maintenance of its line of railway through the Chickasaw Nation, Indian Territory, and that we will on the 25th day of September, 1903, at the hour of 9 o'clock a. m., at the Ada National bank, in the town of Ada, Indian Territory, proceed to appraise and determine all compensation and damages, which may be due you by reason of the taking and appropriation of lands, property and improvements as aforesaid.

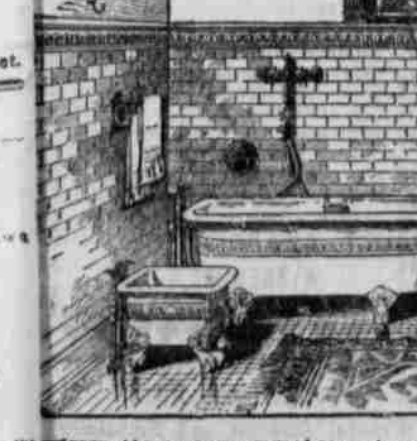
