## COTTON.

Ginners' Report Issued.

The first of a series of bulletins issued by the census ginners' bureau of the department of agriculture on cotton ginned up to Nov. 14, shows that 105 countles out of 812 to report, have ginned 1,244,741 bates against Dr. W. S. Bechtol, dentist. Office 783.344 last year for the same group 21-1m of countles, most of which are localed in Georgia. The increase in the amount ginned is about 62 per cent over last year and indicates abumper crop for Georgia, about 1,600,000 bales. As a result of the bearish showing made by the report the cothis markets soon afterwards lost tiom 15 to 17 points.
