THE
CAMPAIGNCANDIDATES ARE WARMING UP
FOR FINAL STRUGGLE.More Politics Under Discussion Now
in Ardmore Than at any Former
Period—Democrats are Confi-
dent of Victory.

The political campaign in Ardmore, if signs count for anything, will precipitate a hot fight and the candidates are getting their sails in trim for the final struggle that is coming on. The battle will terminate on April 4th. The sentiment must be shaped before that time, however, and for this reason the candidates are beginning to show activity. Politics is being discussed on the streets, in the homes and in fact everywhere. One can sniff it in the air so heavily is the atmosphere charged with political gossip. This condition is mainly due to the action taken by the Republican convention in adopting a platform. This platform is pointed to with pride and with it lies the hopes of the republicans in this campaign. It is stated by them that it is a campaign document worthy of emulation and it is claimed that it is essentially an appeal for good government in city affairs. The key note being sounded the Republicans are preparing for an aggressive fight. As one man said, the Democrats have a subtle foe in the Republicans of the city and they are watching the political machinery with something more than a perfunctory attitude. Those inclined to ridicule Republican strength doubt their own wisdom. The Democratic candidates, however, appear confident and undismayed. The Democratic organization is claiming the election. It does not fear the mysterious stranger in the least. Confidence is an element of success, therefore the organization seemingly, is not troubling its conscience with troubled visions of the future. In their opinion the battle is over. That the Republicans are working adroitly cannot be denied by anyone.

One of them said, "Our platform should be read by every citizen of Ardmore. It shows what we stand for: It is not a question of partisanship. Simply good government that we are advocating and we believe that the people will rally to their cause."

This expression seems to be general among the Republicans, and they seem to be sincere.

The Democrats seem proud of their standard bearer, R. W. Dick, and they say he is a man who has accomplished results in the past and brought Ardmore to the front.

It is especially fortunate that both tickets nominated are composed of good men. As the days go by the interest in the outcome will increase.
