**Newsman Man Talks.** Accompanying the Kansas City Commercial Club is Buck Hayden, staff correspondent of the Kansas City Journal. Mr. Hayden is very familiar with conditions in the territory, having been located at Muskogee for some time in capacity of correspondent for the same paper. He said to a reporter for the Ardmoreite that aside from the business features of the day of the club, the trip would prove of immense value to the territory, inasmuch as the business men were taking a deep interest in the statehood problem and would lend their assistance wherever possible. The influence of the Commercial or gratulation is very powerful and can add the territory in the future. "It has already shown," said Mr. Hayden, "an active disposition to help Indian Territory. The visitors will leave the territory with a better understanding of conditions and affairs.
