ARDMORE PATIENTS STRONGLY ENDORSE NEVILLE.

MARKET LETTER.

Special to Ardmoreite.

Kansas City, Mo., Aug. 26.—The feature of the cattle market this week is the small run in the quarantine division and the moderate supply of native cattle. The unsatisfactory feed demand last week kept down receipts of that class this week, but the market is exactly the opposite of last week, big demand and prices 25 to 40 cents higher. The good country demand and smaller total cattle supply has left a much smaller number of cattle for the packers this week, and prices are naturally higher, 10 to 20 cents on the bulk of the stuff. Quarantine cows are 15 to 25 higher, including canners. Bulk of cows sold at \$2.40 to \$2.65, very few canners below \$2, nothing but some old skins. Veals are 25 to 50 cents higher, best light ones now at \$5.50, heavy ones \$3.75 to \$4.50. Steers have not gained as much as cows, account of the fact that plenty of rangers are now coming to the northern markets, and selling at nearly the same figures as quarantines have been selling at. Best steers sold at \$3.75, against \$2.65 last week, and not many cattle below \$3. The handy weight Osgood steers sold this week at \$3.30 to \$3.45, while 1150 lbs. wintered cattle from the Osgood country topped the market at \$3.75. A better run is expected next week, but the market should be steady, as the demand has not been satisfied this week.

The hog market fluctuates up and down, without much net change in price. Top yesterday was \$6.25, the highest this year, but market is 5 lower today, top \$6.20, bulk of sales \$6.05 to \$6.15. A choice heavy load sold for the top, the best load of heavy hogs seen here in months. Supply here is very small, less than the run at this time last year.

Sheep and lambs are selling strong, although with some fluctuations. A new top was paid for lambs yesterday, \$7.20 for Utahs. Yearlings sell at \$5.25 to \$5.65, weathers \$5 to \$5.10, ewes \$4.40 to \$4.75. There is a large demand for stock and feeding stuff, at \$3.85 to \$4.50, but not much of it is coming.

New York Cotton Market.

Ardmore, Aug. 26.—The following is the New York cotton letter by McIntyre.

The principal interest now centers in what the government crop report due at noon Sept. 5th will show. This is really the most important report of the season. The trade here as well as throughout Europe is now awaiting its publication with more than the usual anxiety owing to the desire to learn whether the official report will confirm many private reports regarding the extent of the deterioration which has taken place in the condition of the crop during the past month and especially Texas and the Atlantic and Gulf states. There has been much rain lately for the best results in the latter district, while Texas has suffered extremely from high temperatures and general need of rain during the past ten days. It is the weather conditions from now on and especially for the next 3 weeks which will make or ruin the top crop and as this can easily influence the final output either way, 500,000 to 1 million bales, the absurdity of venturing a definite crop estimate this time can therefore be readily seen and appreciated.

The future course of the market will therefore continue to be largely influenced by the character of weather conditions as affecting the possibilities for this prospective top crop.

If subsequent events should indicate that the crop is likely to turn out as small a yield as 10 million bales which is impossible from the existing conditions, the prices could easily advance to 12 cents or even higher later in the season as the generality of spinners have made no effort to cover themselves to any extent for next seasons requirements and the south has never been so well organized or so well fixed financially to control the marketing of the crop.
