BIG RAILROAD VENTURE.

Consolidation of Three Small Roads. Double Track New York to Chicago. By Associated Press.

Pittsburg, Aug. 15.—Papers consolidating three small Pennsylvania railroads will be filed this week, which will constitute the formal announcement of a project of prominent foreign bankers associated with Joseph Ramsey Jr., former president of the Washash, to build a low grade double track railroad from New York to Chicago, by way of Pittsburg, to cost about \$150,000,000. Surveys have been made. Electrical locomotives will be used. The road will be known as the New York, Pittsburg and Chicago Air Line. It is sixty-seven miles shorter than the shortest line.

NEGRO ENTERS ROOM.

Unsuccessful Attempt at Assault Followed by Arrest.

South McAlester, I. T., Aug. 15.—A negro entered the home of Mrs. Conrad at Gowan early this morning when her husband was absent and attempted to commit a criminal assault upon her. Notwithstanding that Mrs. Conrad was handicapped by having a four-months-old baby in her arms, she succeeded in fighting off the negro until assistance could come.

The negro was immediately identified by a party of men, and at 2 o'clock p. m. was taken to South McAlester by Deputy Dowel, who made a six-mile run with his prisoner to avoid a mob. It is stated that the negro confessed his crime, but claimed that he was drunk on Choctaw beer.

At the time of the attempted assault the woman's husband was working as night fireman at mine No. 3, at Gowan.

G. A. R. Reunion Day.

Minneapolis, Aug. 15.—This is reunion day at the G. A. R. encampment. The crowd of visitors has greatly increased. It is estimated that visitors here will number 125,000. Six thousand are here from Chicago alone. The campaign for commander is growing warm. The followers of Coney of Kansas, Brown of Ohio, leading candidates, are making an energetic fight.
