PREDICT PANIC IN 1908

BUSINESS WORLD GENERALLY DECLARES PANIC WILL BE RESULT OF PROSPERITY.

It is predicted in the business world and with the mercantile agencies that the general prosperous conditions of this country will result in a panic in the fall of 1908 that will surpass in devastation the panic of 1882. The country at present is in the most prosperous condition it has ever been and every commodity has an inflated value. The R. G. Dunn & Co. agency of Fort Worth, Texas, was here yesterday on business for his concern. Mr. Gately was questioned as to what he thought of the prospects in the business world in this country. He said: "The money market for the past several months has been exceedingly tight and close, on account of the great exposures that have been going on in insurance circles, the probing of the government into the matter of watered stock of railroads, and the rate regulation by the government has caused the money interest to tighten up on their money."

Cotton goods, as well as other goods are worth more today and are as high as the same class of goods were worth before the war. It is not only the case with textile goods but with all classes of goods and everything seems to be abnormally high.

"It may be that with conditions existing as they do and with the money interests holding as they do, that a panic will result in 1908 which will clear away all of the water of the stock of the railroad and other corporations and put values on their proper basis."
