PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

(Published October 28, 1908.)
 State of Oklahoma, Carter Coun-
 ty, ss.

It is ordered by the Board of
 County Commissioners of Carter
 County, Oklahoma, that under the
 laws now in force in the State of
 Oklahoma, all section lines in Car-
 ter County are hereby designated as
 public highways, and that on all
 such section lines shown on plat
 filed in this office by the township
 trustees, designating that they
 should be opened for the benefit of
 the public at large, obstructions are
 hereby ordered removed, on or be-
 fore January 1st, 1909.

And it is further ordered, that
 any section lines not designated
 in the plat filed in this office, it
 will be necessary for the people
 wanting any such lines or roads
 opened to file a petition with this
 Board signed by at least 12 freeholders,
 and any roads other than on section
 lines, the petition must be accom-
 panied with a bond satisfactory
 to this Board; and that this order
 applies to all land and lease own-
 ers, and shall be published in the
 Weekly Ardmoreite until January
 1st, 1909, and shall serve the pur-
 pose the same as if it had been serv-
 ed in person on the parties owning
 or occupying the land. That any
 land owner can ascertain whether
 this order will apply to his land
 from the maps on file in the Coun-
 ty Clerk's office; and if no protest
 is filed within said time, that said
 order, under the order of the
 township trustees, shall proceed to
 take charge and open up and work
 said highways.

SENATOR'S WIFE STOLE

MORPHINE LED HER TO SHOP-
 LIFTING—WIDELY KNOWN
 SOCIALLY.

Boston, Nov. 26.—Mrs. Clara L.
 Barney, the daughter of a Meth-
 odist minister and the wife of Sen-
 ator Milo W. Barney of Swanton, Vt.,
 president of the Swanton Savings
 bank, owner of the Barney marble
 quarry and president of the Swanton
 Woolen mills, was arrested last
 night in Boston on four charges of
 shoplifting.

She gave a false name and was
 held in jail until this morning when
 she was arraigned. She appeared in
 court attired in clothing of most
 expensive kind and of faultless style.

Mrs. Barney is 32 years old and is
 of a striking type. When asked to
 plead she said:

"It was drugs that did it. I was
 crazed at the time. I didn't know
 what I was doing."

Then she admitted the thefts. She
 took a number of valuable pieces
 which were found in her muff.

In answer to questions by the
 judge she admitted she had given
 a false name, but refused to tell
 who she was because, she said, "I
 don't want to disgrace my people."

The case was continued to Friday
 and Mrs. Barney sent back to jail.
 From there she sent a telegram to
 her husband, who is now hurrying
 to her.

Mrs. Barney came to Boston two
 weeks ago to shop and stopped at an
 exclusive hotel. She wore many
 jewels and seemed to have plenty
 of money. She is well known soci-
 ally in Boston and her friends have
 flocked to aid her. The court refused
 to receive bonds until her husband
 arrives here.
