# SAILORS MURDERED VESSEL BURNED

**NATIVES OF NEW BRITAIN LURE OFFICER TO HORRIBLE DEATH THEN ATTACK SHIP.**

Victoria, B. C., Oct. 19.—Further details of the massacre in New Britain early last month, briefly reported in Sydney cables, received by the steamer Marama today, are to the effect that Captain Lindsay, of the ship Rabaul, and ten of his crew were murdered and burned and the trading vessel looted and set on fire, the bodies of some of the victims being thrown into the flames. The steamer Lancoc, which returned to Sydney from the New Britain group shortly before the Marama sailed, reported the occurrence. Her officers said Captain Lindsay, owner and master of the Rabaul, and who was prominent in the New Britain trade, was off the east coast of New Britain recruiting labor, and that about sundown when he anchored his ship for the night, a swarm of native canoes came off and the blacks asked that he come ashore, as plenty of men were ready to sign on as laborers. Captain Lindsay went ashore and was escorted to a big native house where about a hundred blacks were gathered. As soon as he stepped in he was sprung down from behind with a spear and the blacks sprang upon him with knives. He fell bleeding from wounds and was backed to death. The body was then dragged out to the beach by the heels and burned. The flotilla of canoes then went off to the Rabaul and the blacks swarmed aboard. Nine of the ten men of the crew were slaughtered. Then while they lay, some dead, some mortally wounded, on the deck, a raid was made on the stores and kerosene poured over the deck and in the holds, making the ship a funeral pyre for the murdered men. Ship and victims were completely destroyed. Some natives reported the occurrence to the Lancoc, which at once steamed for Herbertsborne and reported it. A German punitive expedition was being prepared when the Lancoc left the islands. A report was also brought from the islands that the French recruiting ship Gaudeloupe was attacked and wrecked by blacks in the New Hebrides at the same time as Malleole and the French captain and the native crew of eight massacred, but no confirmation had been received. A wireless message from H. M. S. Prometheus, stated that some of the natives on the Gaudeloupe had been killed, but the captain and other members of the crew were said to have escaped.
