

BRITISH HEADQUARTERS IN FRANCE. April 30. The entents allied line has been advanced between LaClytte and Kemmel. The France-British forces also have made some progress south of that region.

French forces this morning held the whole of the town of Locre, west of Kemmel, including the hotly contested hospice. The allied line also made some progress, slightly improving the position around Villers Bretonneux.

Yesterday's attack was the biggest

Yesterday's attack was the biggrest effort the German's have yet made in the Flanders offensive, the enemy

in the Flanders offensive, the enemy employing about thirty fresh battalions of reserves, in addition to the large number of divisions in position at the beginning of the battle. A satisfactory feature of the struggle is that the British and Fresch employed relatively small forces to defeat the enemy.

At one point the French were forced to yield a little ground, but supports promptly arrived and drove back the Germans.

By 11:30 o'clock in the morning the Germans had forced their way through near Locre as far as Hydepark corner, between Scherpenberg and Mont Rouge. This was one of the critical moments of the day, but the French counterstacked fercesty and an hour later had preced back the enemy on the flank and held him in the center.

British Casualties in April Reported 52,475; Nine Thousand Killed

LONDON April 30—British casualties reported in April reached a total of 52,475, divided as follows:

Killed or died of wounds: Officers, 7,447; men, 25,584.

Although the complete reports on casualties sustained in the recent heavy fighting in France and Belgium apparently have not heen made, a marked increase is shown in the April figures. The total in March was 14,090, the smallest in several months.

force. Soon Must Show Hand. It appears certain that the Germans soon must disclose their intentions, showing whether they have decided to confine their operations to the present battle front or to oxtend the actual fighting line on one end or the other in the hope of find-

ng a weak spot. The enemy's tactics in the present hattle bear a very close resem-liance to those used in the battle of Verdun in 1916, but on an imof Verdun in 1916, but of an intermedial larger scale. After the opening rush along the entire line for the purpose, if possible, of overwhelming the defenders by pure strength of numbers before they not having completed its seek. ing strong supporting roses on both wings, which would permit them to haunch a second and real offensive with masses of fresh troops concentrated meanwhile opposite the cen-

tral points.
