INOLA FIRST TOWN TO ASK FOR TULSA WATER

Inola, on a direct line between Tulsa and Spavinaw, is the first city to ask to buy water from Tulsa when the new Spavinaw water system is installed. In a letter to The World, dated July 11 and received yesterday, Wesley F. Butler, postmaster at Inola, stated that, being on the conduit that will carry the water to Tulsa from Spavinaw, Inola would like to buy its water supply from this city and asked that he be put in touch with the proper authorities here so that he could take up the matter of having water supplied his city.

The letter was turned over to Mayor Charles Hubbard, who said that he believed that other towns between here and Spavinaw would follow Inola's action in buying their water from the Tulsa main.

LITTLE JOHNNY WOODS HELPED BY TAG SALES

Four-Year-Old Boy Who Never Has Walked a Step Operated on—May Play With Boys Soon

The other day four-year-old Johnny Woods, of Sand Springs, who had spinal meningitis when 14 months old and has never walked a step, was taken to the S. & S. hospital and operated on by Dr. Ralph Smith, orthopedic physician, and now great hopes are held out for his recovery. Doctors say he will even walk in time. And there are scores of others, 75 of them, in fact, being treated by the welfare nurse and workers, and treated free.

Free Clinics Operated.

The clinics were inaugurated two years ago under the leadership of Mrs. G. A. Hallow, chairman of the welfare board, who has given untiring attention to all branches of welfare work. The Frances Willard Home being one of the most worthy. The services of Dr. Raymond Burdick, child's specialist, has been donated to the baby clinic for the two years of its existence and he is in attendance on every occasion. Every Friday morning from 10 to 11 o'clock at the humane office in the courthouse, and every Tuesday from 12 to 1 o'clock at the Celia Clinton School building in West Tulsa, these free clinics are conducted for all children under 15, too poor to obtain medical attention elsewhere, and not only examinations and advice given, but in case medicine can't be bought by the family of the afflicted it is also furnished.

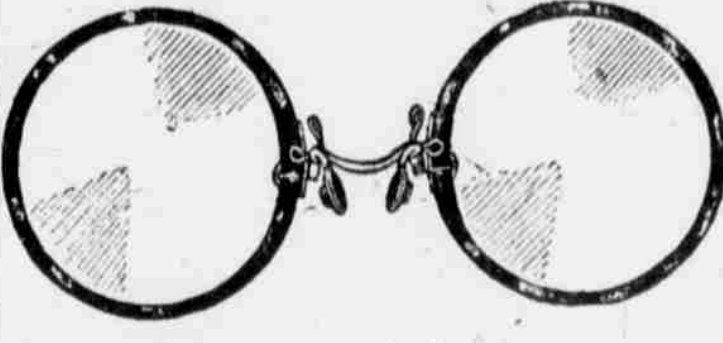
