

100 INDICTMENTS FROM GRAND JURY

Federal Grand Jury in Session Since 20th of September

NO PROFITEERS INDICTED

Complete List Will Not Be Announced Until Arrests Made

OKLAHOMA CITY, Sept. 26.—The federal grand jury brought in 112 indictments in its report submitted at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon to Judge John H. Crotteral at the United States district court. The jury has been sitting since September 12 and has heard about 100 witnesses. There are about 100 white collar indictments in the last month than ever were returned before in the district, according to officers at the federal building. For whisky cases of all sorts, including charges of selling to Indians and to soldiers, introducing liquor to Indian territory and manufacturing liquor, there are approximately 50 indictments. About 10 of the indictments charge conspiracies for various purposes in the sale of securities in the federal trade. There are also several profiteering cases, mail frauds and swindles. These are said to be no inducements for profiteering and hoarding.

The complete list of indictments will not be announced until after the persons named are arrested. All defendants who have not been assigned yet are called to appear before Judge Crotteral to-morrow morning. More than 20 were arraigned before the judge yesterday afternoon after the grand jury had reported.

Among those arraigned were Louis Anadarko, of Creek county, who pleaded guilty to having operated a distillery and who will be sentenced October 16 at Lawton. Many others either pleaded not guilty or asked to be allowed to withdraw their plea to what plea they will make among those included in that classification are the following:



NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—No operation to take back to no wrong numbers, no interminable wait—sounds like a telephone lineups, or the meaning of the promise given by Dr. Lee Forest, who knows wireless as the average school boy knows his ABC's.

The medium through which all of these marvels are to be performed is a newly perfected wireless telephone, which requires only a lamp socket and a device to converse, to put in operation. Throw the line machine into the socket, throw on the switch and your party is on the other end.

The new device consists on the successful application of the alternating current to wireless telephone. The hummin noise that has heretofore made the alternating current objectionable for this purpose, and has caused the use of the direct current and a high-powered generating station, has been eliminated by the use of a small generating plant between Westchester county, N. In further explanation of the device, Dr. De Forest said, "Heretofore wireless transmission of the voice has required the application of an elaborate, complex and expensive method.
