

INCREASE SEEN IN MEXICAN OIL

Former Trade Commissioner Says Production Will Hike Two-thirds

YANKS EASILY SCARED

Go Into Panic at First Hint of Mexican Trouble, Says Man Just Returned

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20.—Petroleum production in Mexico will increase three fold this year, as compared with last year's production, according to H. Cunningham, former trade commissioner to that country, declared today when he reported to the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce on trade conditions in that country.

Found No Discrimination.
"There has been great development in oil in Tehuantepec and there is a great amount of acreage in Lower California, which has to be developed," Cunningham declared. "I found no discrimination against America in the granting of oil concessions. The new tracts must be developed and that takes money."

"American bankers and business men forfeit their great opportunity in Mexico by becoming frightened at every sign of a revolution. Concerns controlled by other countries sit tight and saw wood during a revolution and come out of it more solidly entrenched than before. American firms cancel contracts and demand cash before shipment and always go into a panic every time there is trouble in Mexico. They cannot come to understand the small effect a revolution there has upon business."

Money Only Need.
Cunningham denied stories recently sent from Mexico that the supply of petroleum is getting low. The great demand calls for additional production and this the individuals and concerns operating there are striving to meet, he declared. The vegetable oil industry, the hardwood industry and the sugar industry will have a great future in Mexico, Mr. Cunningham declared. "All they need is money," he explained.

know full well, that Senator Harding very recently said: "I am not interested in clarification; I am interested in rejection. As I have stated at the beginning, I am placing a charitable construction upon your statement that perhaps your partisanship has prevented your reading my addresses and your prejudice has prevented you from realizing

the destructionist attitude of your own candidate; but you have made a statement concerning me, which the records show is false, and I firmly, but respectfully, call upon you to correct this statement at once. Mr. Root, you have arrived at an honorable station in life. Many people trust you. You have no right to deceive them. They want the truth in this campaign. Your conscience will tell you that duty to it should be superior to duty to your party."

Charges Effort to Deceive.

Governor Cox's statement commenting upon the Root message said: "I am today addressing a telegram to Elihu Root calling upon him for an immediate retraction of a false statement in his New York address as to my position towards securing ratification of the treaty and the league."

"I am doing this because it is now against me, and that Mr. Root and the 30 eminent republicans who are for the league associated with him in a statement issued to secure support for Senator Harding, whom they know by his own words is against the league, are attempting to deceive the voters. They are permitting their partisanship to raise above their patriotism and trusting perhaps that the last words of Senator Harding may be in their direction. I am trying to

in my absence, and pointed out that in the statement issued by 31 men, all of whom he knows, and with most of whom he has been associated, they have recommended their countrymen to put into the presidency a man who rejects the only league of nations which has been actually brought into existence and is functioning. They advise voting for the man selected by the very group of republican leaders who have brought the present disgrace upon the republic.

"Dr. Eliot also said that many parts of the statement issued do not conform to the well known facts, but they are misleading and that their expressions of Senator Harding's start are suppressed."

"Nothing I can say would improve upon the expressions of Dr. Eliot but it would seem to me that these eminent republicans, recognized as leaders of thought in America, cannot afford to rest under the cloud which this statement casts upon them."
