### Race of Monkey Men Inhabited California 'Recently,' Is Theory

PALO ALTO, Cal., May 20.—
The probability that California 25,600 years ago was inhabited by a race of men but a jump or two beyond the monkey, was the conclusion of scientists today who have examined a skull found by Brucs Seymour in a creek bank on Stanford university campus.

Dr. Bailey Willis, geologist at the university, advanced the theory that the skull was that of a member of a tribe of wanderers from Asia who came at a time when that continent was connected by land with North America.
