## News of Bristow

SOUTH PENN MAY  
BUILD AT BRISTOWToo Much Work Causes  
Justice to Quit; Real  
Skimming Plant

BRISTOW, Sept. 7.—It is reported here that the South Penn oil company, one of the largest corporations in the United States, is planning the erection of a \$200,000 gasoline plant just north of the city limits. Bristow today is the busiest city and the greatest oil center in the Mid-Continent field.

H. C. Vickers, who has been getting as justice of the peace for Bristow since last February, resigned a few days ago on account of a rush of other business and Tuesday the county commissioners appointed J. H. Brewster, a lawyer, to fill the vacancy. He has already qualified and will assume the duties of his official office.

Duck Tharrell, of Drumnright, has established a skimming plant on Deep Fork creek, and a half mile south of Bristow and is pumping on an average of 150 barrels of oil from the creek daily. The plant is near the Frisco railroad and has installed a loading rack and the oil is pumped from the storage tanks to the loading rack, where it is loaded into tank cars.

The largest rattlesnake ever seen in this part of the state was exhibited here today. The snake measured 22 feet in length, was 16 inches around the body and carried 24 rattles. It was killed near Slick by W. P. Denton, who was traveling through the country in an automobile. His home is at Lockhart, Texas, and he was on his way back to Texas from Henryetta, where he had been visiting friends and relatives.
