Big Trucks Barred From Minn. Highways During Spring Thaw

St. Paul, April 5.—Minnesota trunk highways are being closed to trucks and other motor vehicles of more than two tons, gross weight, on sections now softened by spring thaws and rains. Charles M. Babcock state highway commissioner, today announced that violations are punishable as misdemeanors under the 1921 law.

Formal closing orders were issued to cover the North Shore road—Minnesota trunk highway No. 1—between Duluth and Grand Marais—and the Elk River-Onamia section of trunk highway No. 18. The commissioner said other trunk routes will be similarly protected wherever necessary to prevent heavy hauling from cutting the surface.

Anne Hyde of This City Wins Third Place in Declamatory Event.

East Grand Forks failed to qualify for the finals in the state declamatory contest in the semi-finals held Tuesday in McIntosh, but Anne Hyde, the local contestant, at least won recognition by capturing third place in the girls' event. She gave Mark Twain's "Death Disc."

First place for boys in the McIntosh contest was won by Arthur Wold of Roseau. His subject was "A Place for Cuba." Fred Menke of Park Rapids won second honors with the selection, "Return of Regulus." Moorhead, Ada and Hitterdal were also represented in this event.

In the girls' contest, Ruth Caskey of Bemidji, reciting "Hellgate of Soul," won first; Katherine Dugham of Perham took second place. She gave "The Soul of the Violin." Anne Hyde was awarded third honors. Moorhead and Greenbush also had entries in the girls' event.

NEGOTIATIONS ARE UNDER WAY TO ERECT SUGAR PLANT HERE

Word was received here Tuesday, that H. A. Douglas, president of the Minnesota Sugar company, is planning on erecting a factory in Polk county. Whether the project is undertaken will depend to a large extent on the outcome of the experiments with sugar beets here, but farmers around Fisher, who have been raising the beet extensively for the past two years, are confident that this section is adaptable to the raising of this crop.

Quite a number of farmers in the vicinity of East Grand Forks were given contracts for the raising of beets this year. In all about 250 acres were contracted for.

It is understood that Crookston is anxious to erect a plant located there, in case it is built, but local business men and farmers contend that this is the logical place for the factory, and will use their concerted influence to bring it here.

SMALL BLAZE IN GARAGE OF BAKERY

A small blaze broke out in the garage of Black's Bakery on Brooklyn Boulevard at 6:30 o'clock Tuesday evening. The damage was slight. It is reported.

The fire was caused by the explosion of the gasoline tank of a truck that had been placed in the building. The tank had just been filled before the car was driven in. It is thought that the heat of the engine ignited the gas fumes, causing the explosion. Only the top part of the truck was burned and the inside of the structure scorched.
