Every person who, in any of the counties of this State, between the fiteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of September, in each year, hunts, pursues, takes, kills or destroys quail, partridges or grouse, or any kind of duck, or rail, or march hens, is guilty of a misdemeanor. Every person whe, in the State of Cali-lornia, between the first day of January and the first day of July, January and the first day of July, in each year, hunts, pursues, takes, kills or destroys deves, is guilty of a misdemeanor. Every person who, at any time, gathers or destroys the eggs of any mallard, wood, or summer duck, redhead, teal, gadwell, or gray duck, or any other species of wild duck, is guilty of a misdemeanor. Every person who shall have any of the aforesaid game, or any male deer or buck, or any female deer or doe, or any antelope, elk, or mountain sheep in telope, elk, or mountain sheep in his possession at a time when it is unlawful to kill the same within the county wherein the same is found, shall be prima facie evidence, in any prosecution for a vi-elation of any of the provisions of this section, that the person or per-sons in whose possession the same is found, killed, took, or destroyed the same in the county wherein the same is found, during the per-fed when it was unlawful to take, kill, or distroy the same.
Sec. 2. Section six hundred and
thirty-one of said Penal Code of

the State of California is hereby amended to read as follows:

Any person or persons who shall at any time net, pound, weir or cage or trap any quail, partridge or grouse, or who shall take from any net, pound, weir, cage or trap any quail, partridge or grouse, and retain in his possession, or sell, or give away the same, is guilty of a sdemeanor.

A Glance at the Newspaper History of Los Angeles.

(Santa Ans Herald.)

In the year 1851 the first paper was published in the county, in the city of Los Angeles. It was called the Star, and one half was printed in Spanish and the other half in English. Up to about the middle of the year 1854 the Star had no rival, then a new paper appeared. It was called the Southern Californian, and was printed entirely in the English language. The paper changed title, some time after, and was called the Southern Vineyard, and died in 1860, after a desperate struggle for existence. Shortly after the publithe Star discarded the Spanish feature, and in 1856 El Clamor Publico (The Voice of the People) made its appearance. Thus three papers hung on the ragged edge of de pair up to 1860, when the Vine-yard wilted and bloomed no more, and the Clamor hushed its thunderous cry and sang its plaintive song no more. In January, 1860, the Semi-Weekly News made its appearance, published by the edtor of the Santa Ana Herald, who had, for six years previous thereto, been connected with the Star. In '63 or '64 the Star ceased to shine, and in the five counties of Southern Califernia but one newspaper (the News) was published, doing the legal advertising and nearly all other work required. These counties, however, being sparsely populated, one can hardly imagine the publisher would become a millionaire, even though he did get a DAVIS, "fat take" occasionally. In 1868 STEWART SINGER, QUEEN and the San Diego Union was established, in 1868 the Star was reestablished, and in 1870 the first paper outside the city, the Anaheim

From ers have been constantly starting into existence, some having an ephemeral life, while others yet eke out a precarious support, which the public grudgingly accord them. The business is overdone, but perhaps the Darwinian theory will hold good in this respect.


