

COTTON PICKING SEASON IS NOW IN FULL SWING; SUDAN GRASS THRESHED

LUBBOCK, Oct. 4.—Cotton picking season is in full swing in Lubbock and the South Plains County, according to reports compiled by the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce. The labor situation is being well taken care of in most instances with a high grade of efficient labor at a reasonable price thus far. The farmers in this section have decided to pasture their fields for picking at the present prices to be obtained for the staple. The large sudan crop over the entire section is being threshed and the yield is uniformly high and of an excellent grade. The sudan for the seed is very sluggish and considerable seed are being stored for a future market. More attention is given the hay than before and considerable quantities are being stored for future feeding.

The row crops are all exceptionally fine over the entire section this year with the heaviest yield in grain in many years. The market is off in this commodity also and comparatively little of the grain will be marketed at the present price.

In fact, the market condition of the present fall will do more than many years of teaching and preaching to introduce diversified farming in this section with particular attention to the profitable feeding and marketing of the feed crops on the hoof. Greater interest is being taken in hog and dairy stock and the salvation for the small farmer for the future seems to rest in the spread of this interest and development.

QUESTIONNAIRES BEING SENT TO WEST TEXAS TOWNS RELATIVE COAL SITUATION

STAMFORD, Oct. 4.—A questionnaire is being sent out to each West Texas town concerning the coal situation so that the West Texas chamber of commerce may present the conditions existing in the coal fields to the Federal Coal Commission. All towns in the west at present having difficulty in getting coal or having coal moved over railroads are asked to take the matter up with the organization here.

COLORADO BANK DEPOSITS ARE EXPECTED TO DOUBLE WITHIN NEXT FOUR WEEKS

COLORADO, Oct. 4.—Bank deposits at Colorado, now \$574,294, are expected to double in the next three or four weeks when the present cotton crop begins to move according to a report to the West Texas Chamber of Commerce. The production was estimated at 40,000 bales for the year when the heavy rains began falling. It will now be less than 40,000, but in excess of 32,000 the production in 1919.

MEXICAN LABORERS ARE BEING HELD AT JUAREZ WILL BE RELEASED SOON

STAMFORD, Oct. 4.—Hordes of Mexican laborers assembled at Juarez for trans-shipment to West Texas cotton fields but who are being detained for some reason or another may be released in a few days so that they can help to harvest West Texas cotton crops as a result of the efforts of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, which today wired Inocente Lugo, secretary of State, Mexico City, asking for such relief. The organization has also wired officials at Washington to expedite the release of the men. Telegrams were received today from the Garza county Warhouse and Marketing Association, per Peter Watkins, president; George F. Brittain, Hamilton, Texas; W. L. Fletcher, Hamlin; J. M. Yater, Colorado; W. Z. Pierce, and Peter Watkins of Post City, now at El Paso, awaiting the release of the Mexican labor.

West Texas farmers have taken advantage of the opportunity of importing labor from Mexico through regulations which were recently promulgated. Everything worked smoothly until today. The men were assembled from all parts of Mexico at Juarez, but several have not yet been granted permits by the Mexican government. Hundreds of other pickers are coming to West Texas every day. The price paid ranges from \$1.50 to \$2 per hundred pounds. In most parts of the West the production will range from one-third to one-half bale to the acre. The crop which was the most promising in the history of the West was partially destroyed by the incursions of boll worms following a phenomenal period of wet weather which accelerated their depredations.

The prevailing price of cotton precludes harvesting of all. Many farmers are so dependent on the price conditions that they will not attempt to pick the low grades and picking may practically cease after frost.
