CATTLE DEMAND IS BROAD BUT LOWER
WHEAT SUFFERS BIG DECLINE IN PRICE

FORT WORTH, Texas, Nov. 29.—
Demand for cattle was broad Tuesday
but packers tried to force a decline
through sympathy with losses reported
at all other trade centers and the
movement westward was not as active
as on other days recently. However,
the big end of the day's offering of
2,000 head sold on a steady basis. Some
later deals on cows and steers looked
3 to 15 lower. An offering of 1,500
calves cleared readily on a strong to
25 higher basis. A cut of corn fed
heifers notched \$7.00 and calves
reached \$6.50.
