





The attendance of visitors at the Paris Exhibition numbers 100,000

Prince Pierre Saltzkoff, who recently died in Paris, was a curious character. He was immensely wealthy, and spent his entire fortune in collecting works of art or curiosi-

ties. Before he died he was obliged to sell his collection in order to keep mself from starvation. Bismarck has never been a favorite mongst jingo Englishmen; and a London correspondent of a New York journal states that "were the German Chancellor to appear in public anywhere in London, he would meet with a reception similar to that accorded to Marshal Haynan a generation ago." In other words

The Jewish community in London will, says the Jewish Chronicle, shortly receive a rare guest in the person of a lady Back for or Arts t the Bombay University, Miss Mariam Samuel. She is the daughter of a Prussian merchant settled in Bombay, and has obtained her position at the university solely through private instruction.

Mr. John Aitken has recently

submitted to the Royal Society of Edinburgh, an apparatus for counting dust. the train held while a messenger went back upon a locomotive and fetched it. The Rev. Hugh Callan, of Glasgow, created a sensation at Jerusalem recently by entering the gates of the City of David on a bicycle. It was the first machine of the kind the inhabitants had seen, and the streets were thronged with people attracted by the novel sight. Mr. Callan travelled from Paris to Constanti nople, then crossed Asia Minor to Alexandria, where he was obliged to

take steamer, as there was no road.

There is excitement in newspaper circles over the report that James Gorden Bennett has gone to Khartoum on an important mission. He left Paris three weeks ago, went to Marseilles, then to Alexandria, and then to Cairo. Two stories are cabled in explanation of the singular journey. One is that at the Club Mereton, in Paris, an officer who had seen service in the Egyptian Army said it was impossible for a foreigner to enter Khartoum and depart alive. Bennett offered a heavy wager that he could do it within six months. The bet was accepted and Bennett, accompanied by a friend, started. The other story is that Bennett received a dispatch from his Cairo correspondent, stating that he had received a visit from an envoy of the Mahdi with important news regarding Chinese Gordon; that the latter was still alive and kept a close prisoner; that the new Mahdi, by reason of his reverse at Kordofan and Bahral-Chazal and the loss of the great Province of Darfur, was willing to ransom Gordon for 1,000,000 francs. The next few days Bennett made all arrangements for the trip and the payment of the vast sum mentioned, and with a friend set out for Egypt,
