Reports of Committees—New Committees Appointed, Etc.

A semi-annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Queen's Hospital was held in the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce yesterday June 20th at 11 a.m.

There were present: A. J. Cartwright, James I. Dowsett, S. M. Damon, C. P. Iaukea, W. G. Irwin, Rev. Alex. Mackintosh, Samuel Parker, M. P. Robinson, J. H. Paty, H. A. Widemann, and John S. Walker.

The chairman in a few chosen words alluded to the death of one of the oldest members of the Board, the Hon. W. C. Paroh, who was originally elected on March 25, 1865, and announced a consequent vacancy in the Board.

The following gentlemen were appointed as the visiting committee for the ensuing quarter: S. M. Damon, Rev. Alex. Mackintosh and H. A. Widemann.

The treasurer's report gave total receipts \$13,548.23; disbursements \$14,373.53. Balance due treasurer \$825.28.

The physician's report for the quarter ending May 31, 1889, states that the number of patients at present in the hospital is 39.

The forty-eighth anniversary of Oahu College was held at Central Union Church yesterday evening when a large number of ladies and gentlemen assembled to witness the ceremonies.
