Mr. Sharretts, in a recent statement in regard to his mission, said:

ing will begin in about six weeks after my arrival in Shanghai. As I understand, the commissioners of the other powers are to leave for China about the same time that I do, so we will arrive there within a few weeks of one another, and the meetings will begin soon afterwards. Upon my arrival in Shanghai, I will be furnished with the chrical force that is to assist me in the performance of my mission. My entire stay in China may consume a year.

"Before leaving China for home I am practically certain of having another duty to perform. The acting secretary of state informs me that I will probably be selected by the President, in conjunction with the American minister to China, Mr. Conger, to negotiate, a new commercial treaty with China. This duty may or may not keep me abroad a little longer than I at present expect. will include all points of interest between Honolulu and the Volcano.
