**The Quinquennial Census of London.**

The result of the census, taken for the purpose of ascertaining the number of persons present within each parish in the administrative county of London on the night of Sunday, March 29, has not yet been officially declared, but the return will show an increase of about 221,000 in the population of the prescribed area since the census of 1891. At that date the population of the administrative county, which includes the hamlet of Penge, was 4,232,118. We may, therefore, reckon that the total was raised at the close of March last to something like 4,453,000. When the census of 1891 was taken, the population of Penge was found to be 20,375. In 1894 it was estimated by the Registrar-gen. at 20,589, showing, therefore, a small rate of increase. If we add the whole of the quinquennial increase of the administrative county to the population of London, as shown in 1891, we get a total of 4,432,743. The Registrar-gen. has estimated that the population of London, by the middle of the present year, would be 4,435,955. But there is a gain of 3 months in this reckoning, owing to the circumstance that the national census is taken at the commencement of April, or 3 months earlier than the Midsummer epoch. As there is an increase of more than 43,000 in the population of London in a year, the 3 months deduction will bring down the estimate to 4,425,000 for March last, or a quinquennial increase of a little over 213,000. It happens that, if we take the increase estimated by the Registrar-gen. for each year from 1891 to 1895, both inclusive, thereby constituting a quinquennial period, the increase becomes 212,593. The recent census seems to show a more rapid growth.

**The American Presidency.**

Mr. Cleveland's presidency of the U. S. A. is on the point of closing, and Americans will in November have to select his successor. It is more than likely that the next four years will see at the White House Mr. McKinley, a violent Republican and Protectionist. This directly concerns foreign nations generally, and, most of all, Great Britain. Although Mr. McKinley's views on the gold and silver question are elastic, that is not the case in regard to the tariff. He has never wavered in his

carried to the extreme point. When the fiscal system associated with his name operated in the States, many branches of British trade suffered severely by loss of American custom. But no sooner was the tariff modified by Mr. Cleveland than they began to recover these losses, and in some instances even gained ground. As there is no reason to suppose that Mr. McKinley is a less ardent Protectionist than in his earlier career, his election to the Presidency would undoubtedly be a serious misfortune to British commerce.—The People, (England.)

**Old Sports Reviving.**

It is reported that the ancient and once highly honored game of bowls is coming back into fashion at great country houses. There is much more interest in it than in croquet, while the exercise taken by the players is of quiet and soothing character compared with the violent exertions necessary to success at lawn tennis. Another capital game which the modern generation condemns as vulgar is skittles. But it has the drawback of making the walkin' ring, while putting up the pins is anything but a labor of love. Bowls, on the contrary, make no noise; and, when the jack is replaced, the battle can be at once renewed. The game has the further advantage of being playable on a much smaller ground than lawn tennis, and no covered court is needed, as in the of case skittles.—English Exchange.
