IN SYMPATHY WITH AMERICA.

Majority of the People of England Against Spain - Scotland and Northern Ireland Practically Solid for the United States-Non-Conformists Are All Pro-American, While the Roman Catholics Favor Spain.

LONDON, May 2.- The question as to whether British sympathy is really with America is still agitating those who are chiefly interested in establishing a good understanding between the two nations. Alfred Harmsworth who, personally and through his paper, has been doing the most efficient work in this direction is convinced that a large majority of the people of the United Kingdom are unreservedly in sympathy with the United States. He bases his conviction on a careful canvass of the country, which he has just completed. It shows that Scotland is practically solid for America, and that Ireland, except in the north, is hostile to America. Of the merchants, shippers and business men generally, 30 per cent are keenly American; 35 per cent are neutral and 35 per cent are against war anywhere.

The non-conformists are solidly pro-American, while 90 per cent of the Roman Catholics are pro-Spanish in all cases, according to the figures collected.

The British aristocracy, aside from the Catholies, is evenly divided, while the Jews are opposed to Am-

On the subject of Catholic opposition to America, the Daily Mail is an article printed to-day, says: "It is largly due to distinguished members of the Catholic artistocracy and to the Catholic prelacy of the United Kingdom and Ireland that a slight sympathy for Spain has been worked up during the past few days. The priests and people alike are intent on showing their interest in the country which is a firmer stronghold of the church than Italy, and great efforts are making to force the trend of public opinion. This fact and the strong Irish feeling explains why so few Nationalist members of of the House of Commons have spoken publicly in favor of the United States. Redmond and Dillon have spoken, but the latter was immediately attacked by the widely circulated Catholie organ in England, the Catholic Times."

PAPERS HAVE CHANGED TUNE.

The German Press Called Down Very Hard by the Government-Take Their Lesson and Now Praise the Stand Taken by the United States.

Berlin, April 30 .- Public attenion is so engrossed with the Hispano-American struggle that the re-convening of the Reichstag and Prussian Diet have been almost unnoticed. The newspapers print entire pages of war news from all parts, mostly unreliable, and much of it is unfavorable to the United States. Extras are repeartedly issued alleging great naval disasters to the Americans. One of the worst offenders announced on Wednesday evening last that four American warships had been blown up (giving among the victims a fictitious ironclad) off Buenos Ayres. As a whole, however, the German press has ceased its hostile tone toward the United States. For this change the Government is entirely responsible, as all the newspapers which are in the habit of obtaining information from the Foreign Office, which includes all newspapers of importance in the empire, were this week given a hint to stop their abuse of the United States as being directly opposed to the Government's attitude, besides being unpatriotic and politically unwise. The hint was effective, and not a line directly hostile to America has since been printed in any paper. Several newspapers, notably the Frankfort Zeitung, have adopted a distinctly friendly tone respecting the war.

The fact that Paris, Rome and Portuguese newspapers, which are even more unfriendly to the United States than the German newspapers were, all point out that the war is a

conflict of the Latins against the Anglo-Saxons, also has had some effect in bringing about the quick change in Germany, and some of the formerly most hostile German newspapers are now emphasizing the view that the interests of Germany are entirely on the side of Ameries. For instance, the Berlin Post. which enjoys close relations with Prince Hohenlohe, the Imperial Chancellor, and which bitherto has roundly abused the United States as "rapacious" and "pharisaical," now quotes utterances of French newspapers and deduces therefrom that it must be clearly to Germany's interests to side with the enemies of France.
