#### FREE PASSAGE TO CHINA

Clever Ruse to be Sent Home at the Expense of the United States.

The Chinese are at their old trick of having the Government pay thei: passage to China when they get tired of amassing wealth in this

The latest phase of this confidence game came to light last Wednesday. On the afternoon of that day Police Judge Low telephoned to the Chinese Bureau the information that he had been informed that in a wash house on Bryant street was a Chinaman who had no certificate of registration and who therefore was

illegally in the United States.

A Chinese Inspector was sent to the address given and the coolie was placed under arrest. About half an hour after his arrest another Chinaman, fat, sleek and groomed, walked into the Chinese Bureau and informed Chief Meredith that he bad arrived here a few days ago in transit to Mexico and had recently smuggled himself juto California across the Mexican border. He was willing to be deported at once. He also was placed under arrest and Collector Jackson notified of the facts of the case. There was no doubt that both men are entitled to remain here and that they have destroyed or concealed their certificates in the expectation that the Government will give them a free passage to China.

Collector Jackson said yesterday that there is a statute imposing a penalty of one year's imprisonment upon any native of China other than of American parentage, who may be a laborer, found in this country without a certificate. The statute has never been enforced because it was sought to avoid the ex-pense of keeping the offenders in jail for a year, but the Collector says that it is his intention to enforce it in cases like the present, where Chinese, concealing their certificates, seek to obtain passage home to China at the expense of this Gov ernment.—S. F. Call.

OHINESE PERJURERS.

Judge de Haven Puts Up the Bars Against Hosts of Mongolian Raiders

United States District Judge de Haven rendered an opinion yesterday which will be gladly received by the friends of white labor. It was in the case of Jew Wong Loy, who sought to obtain admission to the United States on the ground that he was born in California. United States Commissioner Heacock, before whom the testimony was taken refused to recommend the landing of the applicant because he did not believe the witnesses. Judge de Haven's opinion upholds the recommendation of the Commissioner and adds:

"Congress has not enacted that when a person of Chinese descent claims to have been born in the United States he must establish such fact by testimony of witnesses other than Chinese. This omission cannot be supplied by the court, and therefore Chinese persons are competent witnesses in cases of this character, but their credibility is for the court to determine, and in proceedings like this, where only this class of witnesses testify that a Chinese person applying for admission was born in this city, unless the court is fully satisfied of the truth of such testimony its finding should follow the presumption that a Chinese country of the c nese person coming from China and seeking to land in the United States is an alien and not a native born citizen of this city.—S. F. Call.

DEATH OF "OLD SLEUTH."

Harlan P. Halsey, Well-Known Writer of Fiction, Is Summoned.

NEW YORK, Dec. 17.-Harlan Halsey, the author known as "Old Sleuth," died last night of cerebral hemorrhage at his home in Brook-lyn. He was born in New York

Robert Treat, the first Colonial Governor of Connecticut, was one of his ancestors, and Halsey was a member of the Sons of the Revolu-

In all, he had written 135 books, and his fortune was estimated at \$500,000. He wrote often two books a week. His last book was "Only a Photograph."

He was a member of the Union League Club of Brooklyn and of the Board of Education.
