THE CZAR'S TROOPS IN THE PAMIRS.

This is an Act of Aggression Against the British Interest. Believed in England That It Will Be Difficult to Avert Armed Conflict.

Special Dispatch to The Call.

LONDON, March 10.—A dispatch from Allahabad, capital of the north-west province of India, says it is reported there from Yarkand, Chinese Turkestan, that a large force of Russian troops has arrived at the Russian post, Fort Murghabi, on the Murghabi River, in the Sari (great) Pamir, with the intention of seizing Sir-I-Kel, the hundred-mile stretch of territory north of the Mustagh Mountains, which was left undefined by the Pamir boundary commission in 1895.

Its seizure by Russia will cause complications with England.

LONDON, March 10.—The weekly papers issued on Saturday will treat China as the cardinal question. The Spectator will say:

It is coming rapidly to this—Europe must make serious agreements respecting the spheres of influence in China with well defined boundaries, or the effort to prevent a general war will be a failure. We regret the necessity, for we can foresee the terrible strain on the resources of Great Britain, which are already somewhat overtaxed, but we can perceive no other way out of the impasse. Lord Charles Beresford's policy of keeping the open door by reviving China and so obtaining a dominant influence at Peking is impossible. Corpses never revive.

The Speaker says: We are primarily committed to the open door and the maintenance of the integrity of China. We are also partially committed to an approval of the system of spheres of influence which may disintegrate China. Must we not insist that the policy of partition go no further until the matter has been discussed in European conference? Meanwhile it is our duty to civilization to defend free trade by every means.

The Outlook, regarding partition of some kind as inevitable, urges, before trouble becomes irretrievable, the convening of a conference of the powers to agree to broad principles on which the partition of China may be pacifically effected. It suggests that The Hague conference put aside academic points and deal with the greatest menace to peace, namely, the international scramble in China. Connecting the Muscat incident with the Far Eastern question, the Outlook remarks:

Of the five powers who have established themselves territorially in China only one—England—has safeguarded her seaway thereto by strong places for supplies and repair. Until the others are similarly equipped they must be more or less at the mercy of England in the event of war, which now seems inevitable.

MARYSVILLE WOOLEN MILLS LIE IN RUINS.

Frank Peck, a Bay City Wheelman, Loses His Life During a Conflagration.

MARYSVILLE, March 10.—A fire that broke out at 8 o'clock this evening destroyed the Marysville Woolen Mills, located in the heart of the city. The blaze was first discovered in the engine-room on the floor of the two-story brick structure. The supposed cause was spontaneous combustion.

During the progress of the fire Frank Peck of Yuba City, aged 19 years, a prominent Bay City Wheelman, entered the building and was overcome by smoke. He was burned to death.

Superintendent Knight places the loss at \$100,000; insurance, \$80,000. A large stock of wool and finished goods was destroyed. The machinery was rendered useless. Luckily there was no heavy wind. The fire throws 100 persons out of employment.

MEN NAMED FOR WAR PORTFOLIO.

Speculation as to Alger's Successor.

NEW YORK, March 5.—The World this morning says that last night it received advices from Washington to the effect that General Anson C. McCook might succeed General Alger as Secretary of War. General McCook attended a private dinner party at 54 West Fifty-sixth street last night, but to a world reporter would say nothing about the report.

A special to the Journal from Washington says: General "Joe" Wheeler may be the next Secretary of War. The President, when he heard how Speaker Reed insulted the general by refusing to recognize him on the floor of the House, was indignant. Several gentlemen talked over the matter with the President this evening, and when they left the White House the news became current that General Wheeler would succeed Alger, and that the latter might oblige his friends by announcing his willingness to retire next week. The President, it is said, will appoint Wheeler, for manifold reasons, to enthrone the South, to reward a hero, to show Democrats the breadth of the Presidential mind and to announce that money is not an issue, but that expansion is.
