### Will Aguinaldo Yield?

MANILA, June 21.—General Mac-  
Arthur formally announces Presi-  
dent McKinley's order of amnesty.  
Buencamino, Paterno and other  
prominent Filipino leaders are gen-  
erally pleased, as they believe that,  
under the amnesty, they can bring  
about the surrender of Aguinaldo,  
who, they declare, is ready and will-  
ing to consider the peace platform  
adopted by the Filipino leaders,  
with a few insignificant exceptions.

Several meetings of the leaders  
were held quietly in Manila last  
week. They are encouraged by the  
progress they are making with the  
natives and the authorities here. It  
is the consensus of opinion of the  
foreigners, the better class of the  
Filipinos and the Spaniards that  
Aguinaldo will appear in Manila  
shortly as a result of the decree and  
the negotiations of Buencamino.

MANILA, June 21.—Two hundred  
Filipinos met this morning in Ma-  
nila to determine honorable and  
decorous methods for securing  
peace. The results were submitted  
this evening to General MacArthur,  
who accepted them.

Senor Paterno presided and Senor  
Buencamino, the originator of the  
movement, Senor Flores, General  
Pio del Pilar, General Garcia, Gen-  
eral Macabulos and other prominent  
revolutionists were present.

It was evident that Senor Paterno  
was convinced that he could obtain  
Aguinaldo's sanction to a peace  
based upon the following seven  
clauses, which, after four hours,  
were unanimously accepted as com-  
patible with an honorable peace:

First—Amnesty.

Second—The return by the Ameri-  
cans to the Filipinos of confiscated  
property.

Third—Employment for the re-  
volutionary generals in the navy  
and militia when established.

Fourth—The application of the  
Filipino revenues to succor needy  
Filipino soldiers.

Fifth—A guarantee to the Fili-  
pinos of the exercise of personal  
rights accorded to Americans by  
their constitution.

Sixth—Establishment of civil gov-  
ernments at Manila and in the  
provinces.

Seventh—Expulsion of the friars.

The statement of the seventh con-  
dition was vociferously acclaimed  
the entire assemblage shouting,  
"Expel, expel."

PORTLAND, Or., June 21.—The  
United States transport Lenox ar-  
rived to-day from Manila.

### Increase of Pay.

WASHINGTON, June 21.—The Navy  
Department has issued a general  
order under the terms of the last  
appropriation act increasing the  
pay of naval officers on shore in  
Porto Rico, Cuba, the Philippines,  
Hawaii and Alaska by 10 per cent,  
and for the enlisted men of the  
marine corps ashore at those places  
20 per cent, said increase to be com-  
puted from May 26 last.
