Where Are Hawalian Cranges?

Those who have walked along the business streets recently have noted the large supply of oranges of unusual size and flavor that are being offered for sale at ridiculously low prices. Ten cents a dozen for oranges four and five inches in diameter and perfect in appearance and taste, would astound the visitor, yet it is passed over here without comment. Yet everybody does not know that the crop of this delicious fruit is unusually large this year. The season opens with the beginning of November and is most active during the winter months, yet it continues practically throughout the whole year. This season will produce between nineteen and twenty one thousand car-loads for Eastern shipment, besides the local consumption, which is considerable. The larger part of this crop will come from the southern counties, but the "northern citrus belt," of which Oroyille, in Butte County, is the centre, will also be a large producer. These estimates are based upon the figures prepared by the Scuthern Pacific Company, which handles practically all of the Eastern shipment, and are based upon what has already been shipped and what is likely to be shipped during the remainder of the season. This exceeds the shipments of any previous year, and proves that California has every reason to be proud of its citrus production .- S. F. Argonaut.
