FEBRUARY TERM.

Matters Before the First Circuit Court in Jury and Chambers.

The jury in the case of Wong But Nam vs. Chock Sing found for plaintiff last Friday and gave verdict for \$45. This morning the defendant filed a motion for new trial.

The defendants in the nine grand jury indictments appeared before Gear this morning, eight being for larceny and one for malicious injury. When arraigned one plead guilty and eight not guilty. Kauhae, the guilty one, was given three months to serve in jail for larceny.

Judge Gear and a jury will hear the case against Mauuahi, for malicious injury, this afternoon.
