Latest News Items of Interest from Other Lands.

The following are cullings made from our late exchanges:

MAY LYNCH ARIZONA MURDER

Tucson, Ariz, Feb. 10.—Two Mexicans who are supposed to have murdered A. H. Vail, a well known rancher, near Mammoth last week and burned his body were captured at Dudleyville last night. One of them afterward escaped from jail and a posse is now on his trail. There is talk of lynching should the man be recaptured.

LEARY AND BREWER WIN RACES.

Chicago, Feb. 10.—The 100 yard scratch swimming race at the Sportsmen's show to-night was won by J. Scott Leary of San Francisco. Time, 1:09. The 200-yard race was won by Brewer of San Francisco. Time, 2:19 1-5.

TO INCREASE PENSIONS OF VETERANS.

Washington, Feb. 10.—The Senate Committee on Pensions to day authorized a favorable report on the bill introduced by Senate Jones of Arkansas increasing pensions of Mexican War veterans. The bill applies to the survivors of that war who are pensioned or may be pensioned hereafter under the acts of 1887, 1891 and 1897. It gives each of them a pension of \$12 per month.

LONDON NEWSPAPER CHANGES HANDS.

London, Feb. 10.—Another change has taken place in the proprietorship of the Daily News of this city, George Cadbury having bought out his copartners. A number of new departures are contemplated. A special feature will be made of social reform. Betting and turf news will be excluded from the paper, but the reporting of other sports will be continued.

CHALLENGES FORMER PREMIER TO DUEL.

Madrid, Feb. 10.—Senor Ibaury, a Republican Deputy, has challenged Senor Silvela, the former Premier, to fight a duel in consequence of his criticisms in the Chamber of Deputies on February 8 of Ibaury's connection with the agitation in Valencia.

LIVES TO THE AGE OF 109.

Portland, Or, Feb. 10.—Mrs. Nancy Jane Roberts, 109 years of age, is dead in Sherwood, near this city. She came to Oregon from Missouri in 1852.

MOUNTED POLICE SERGEANT'S SUICIDE

Seattle, Feb. 10.—Telegraphic advices to Skagway received by the Steamer Farallon state that Sergeant H. M. Jackson of the Northwest Mounted Police committed suicide at Dawson on January 30. He placed a revolver in his mouth and sent a bullet through his brain. He left no word in explanation of the deed.

BROOKSIDE IS BURNED.

Fort Wayne, Ind, Feb. 11.—Brookside, the suburban summer home of J. H. Bass, the millionaire founder, was burned this morning. Loss, \$2,0,000.

FEARS INQUIRY BUT NOT DEATH.

New York, Feb. 9.—Bartholomew F. Clune, a New York policeman, committed suicide to day by shooting rather than answer charges which had been preferred against him. It was alleged against him that on the night of February 3 he went into a cigar store and without provocation abused a number of young men in the place.

ACCIDENT IN CHURCH ENDS 13 LIVES.

Panama, Feb. 9.—An accident in the Church of Horencitos, in Chiriqui, resulted in the death of thirteen persons and the severe wounding of thirty others.
