Duel in France Over Dreyfus.

PARIS, October 6.—The death of Emile Zola was the indirect cause of a duel today between General Percin, chief of the cabinet of the Minister of War, and Gaston Polonais, a well-known Nationalist writer, who was responsible for the statement that General Percin met Dreyfus at Zola's late residence and shook hands with him. The General, in his letter replying to the question of Count Boni de Castellane on this subject, described M. Polonais as a "renegade Jew," and also told the Count he did not admit the latter had any right to judge his actions.

M. Polonais then challenged General Percin and they fought with swords, near St. Cloud, today. The General was slightly wounded in the hand.

The duel occurred on the estate of Colonel Picquart's brother-in-law, M. Gaste. It lasted for twenty-five minutes and both men fought vigorously. M. Polonais was pricked in the arm in the first encounter.

General Percin's sword broke in the fifth round. The General received his wound in the hand in the seventh encounter. A vein and a tendon were severed. The doctors then stopped the duel.

Blue Ribbon Bananas.

The Herald is in receipt of a sample of Cuban plantains grown by George W. Paty at Iliales, Olan. The samples were taken from a bunch weighing 80 pounds and were cut twenty months after planting. For a delicious flavor and size the Hawaiian variety is not to be compared with the Cuban plantain. It has a richness of color unknown to island bananas and in size the Cuban exceeds by several ounces to each banana. They are very few of this variety grown in Hawaii, Mr. Paty being one of a limited number of growers bringing the fruit to maturity—Hawaii Herald.

The Japanese Navy.

It is stated that the programme for the extension of Japan's Navy in the third stage has been decided on, and nothing but a want of money prevents the Government from carrying out the scheme. The work would extend over eight years and cost about Y200,000,000. It is proposed that when the scheme goes into operation all vessels, with the exception of the battleships, shall be built in Japan.
