

WOMAN AND HOME.

A RADICAL AND CURIOUS DIFFERENCE BETWEEN MEN AND WOMEN.

Hints on House-Cleaning—"Fresh Air" Philosophy—Nerves, Diet and Study—Familiarity Breeds Beauty—Society Customs.

[Editor Max in Detroit Free Press.] I have many times observed in the superior tact with which woman adapts herself to circumstances. In deed, her impulse in that direction is instinctive. He must be a wise man who shall teach a why that is so. We know the migratory habits of birds. The assumption is that the Creator endowed them with a knowledge when to fly southward and of the time to fly northward. I assume, also, that the creation theory is applicable to women, as an explanation of her natural desire to fly from base surroundings. It is not worth while to argue that there are many debased women. We all know it; but the reason for it is found in artificial circumstances.

Debasement is unnatural to woman. Even in that condition, however, she illustrates a kind of superiority that seems to me inherent. The outcome is, perhaps, rock-ets of her good nature, but it is only in the last stage of her descent into the social abode that she becomes indifferent to those refinements which make her attractive. Thus (to deal merely with the small facts of the case) she appears in her dress, in her clothing, she affects the amenities which pure women practice; cleanliness is the governing article of her creed; and she has the insatiable stomach for conquest that the world knew all about long before Deila's time.

The debased man holds all refinement in contempt. He makes no sustained effort to escape from his wallow. He is vicious in the degree that he is debased. He takes no kindly to rags as to royal raiment. His speech, his thoughts, his acts are always coarse, often brutal. Dith, literal and other, make him best. A bath gives him moral hydrophobia. He does not care to hide his arses under a garment of assumed politeness. In short, he is the embodiment of "reason fled to brutish beasts."

Here, then, are two propositions that seem to establish a radical and curious difference in the natures of men and women. That difference, as we find it illustrated in the varying phases of every-day life, must always be a fascinating study to those who seek for the philosophy of things. Take the woman who marries above her station. At first thought many would be inclined to say that she is fatally misplaced and that she must be a cause of endless humiliations to her husband. But no man who has learned the alphabet of the woman nature could be misled by such superficial glances as that. Here is a significant situation in which the womanly advantages almost strikingly demonstrate. True, she comes from a comparatively low station, but instead of being a clog to her husband's aspirations, and a daily witness to his supposed folly in contracting a mismatch, she steps into her new office conscious of its demands and early compels both respect and admiration.

Do you begin to see that she thus presents another former low estate and all its unrefined accompaniments of forces that is inevitable? Or course she wins the victory! Genius for that kind of generalship is her birthright. I think I ought to add here that she does not use any noisy powder or fight her battles of this sort to the sound of gongs. Let a man marry a woman who is in station and accomplishment his superior, and then make your computation of the time and pain that must be devoted to him before he gives the least sign of progress. You will estimate the resources of arithmetic without arriving at a satisfactory result. I have never known a man who was little out of a groveling condition by marriage with a woman whom he knew and who was not his superior. Almost invariably it is the darker side of the picture that is presented. By this I mean that while on the one hand the woman of low surroundings makes marriage a means to a higher and clearer atmosphere readily accommodating herself to the changed order, another woman, of better rearing, who marries below her order is quite prone to descend to her husband's plane.

Hints on House-Cleaning. ("Carol Hess" in Tid-Bits.) There are several things that I want to remind you of to make the disagreeable part of your work easier. If you must (as sometimes happens) take up a carpet without carrying out your stove, do not get down on your knees and lift it till you "see stars" all every time in your body creek. Do not try to lift the stove with one hand and pull the carpet out with the other; but get a big stick of wood and use it as a lever. You will scarcely feel the weight as all that way, and a little child can draw the carpet out for you, if you tell him just how. After your carpet is out, sprinkle the floor plentifully with wet sawdust, or damp earth. This will clean the dirt up so well (when you sweep it all out together) that you need not scrub the floor till your wood-work is all clean.

Put a little aqua ammonia in the water when you clean your paint. If you have a scrubbing-water will save you time, soap, and "elbow-grease." Beat your carpets with a horse-whip. Use turpentine to take out paint-spots. Four hot tallow through ink-stains to remove them. Use hot vinegar to take paint-spots off of the window-glass. If there are moths in your garret or closet, sprinkle the floor with benzine. KEEP IT CAREFULLY AWAY FROM THE FIRE. Put salt in your whitewash to make it stick. A few drops of liquid bluing will make it look all the whiter when it is on the wall. Use turpentine to clean nickel-plated ornaments. Use salt and vinegar to clean brass ornaments. Use common baking-soda (with a damp flannel rag) for silver.

When you whitewash the top and sides of your cellar, put coppers-water in the whitewash, to drive away all kinds of vermin. If vegetables on the cellar-bottom have made a damp spot, sprinkle coppers-water there. Rub old furniture and picture-frames with kerosene oil. When you clean your stove, a little sugar in the blacking will make it stick better and last longer. To clean willow furniture, use salt and water. Apply it with a coarse brush, and dry thoroughly. Wash the mica in your stove-doors with vinegar and water to remove the smoke from the inside.
