killed three men, and the last man I got was the jailer of my county.' The constable immediately reported the facts to the authorities of the West Virginia county and the stranger is being kept under survelMance until the Breathitt county

authorities are heard from. A picture of Noble and a good description were immediately sent to the writer of the letter and the Breathitt officials are expecting to hear of Noble's arrest at any time.
