**Registration Closes**  
**October 9th**

All voters who wish to vote at the general election this fall, who have not already registered, must not forget that they will have to register before October 9th. Therefore it is important that all parties desiring to vote, get busy and register at once.

All persons who were registered and who voted at the general election in November, 1914, or who have registered since that time, need not re-register, but those who have moved to other precincts than where originally registered, should have their registration cancelled and register in the precinct where they now reside.

All persons who reside within 10 miles of the court house must register by appearing before the county clerk at his office, but those who reside further than 10 miles from the court house, may register by appearing before a justice of the peace or a notary public or a special deputy registrar.
