# STATE HIGHWAYS

Oscar Rohn Explains New Sys-tem—Stuart Morrow is Rotary Club Guest.

A comprehensive report of the new system of road building and maintenance in Montana under the direction of the new state highway commission appointed by Governor Stewart was made at the weekly luncheon meeting of the Butte Rotary club today by Oscar Rohn, a member of the commission. He detailed in full the objects of the commission and what they hoped to accomplish. Attorney Tom Davis, vice president, was in the chair. A guest of honor was Stuart Morrow, who founded the first Rotary club beyond the At lantic eight years ago in the city of Dublin, Ireland.

Mr. Davis opened the meeting by attending to the general business of the organization. He then introduced Mr. Morrow, who explained how he had traveled for a few years in Ireland, England and Scotland founding spokes of the Rotary wheel in Dublin, Belfast, Glasgow, Edinburgh, Liverpool and London. He has recently made a trip through various states in the west. He was given an enthusiantic reception.
