

# TIC SUPPLIES ED AT CAMP

Meeting Will Soon Be Called  
to Raise Needed Funds  
for Equipment.

A meeting of public-spirited citizens to raise funds to provide athletic equipment for the Montana boys at Camp Lewis, American Lake, will be called within a few days by Mayor W. H. Maloney, who received an appeal this morning from Capt. A. W. Bradbury. A committee will be appointed to arrange the meeting. The letter to the mayor reads as follows:

"Dear Sir: The commanding officer of this regiment, the 32d Infantry, is endeavoring in every way to encourage athletic sports within the regiment but is handicapped by lack of athletic equipment and funds and is, therefore, forced to appeal to the various communities from which the men of the regiment come.

"The regiment is comprised of men from Utah, Wyoming, Montana and Nevada, and the colonel commanding has directed me to communicate with the mayors of the principal cities of these states with a view of obtaining donations of athletic supplies and funds from such commercial clubs, other organizations, public-spirited citizens, etc., who may be interested in the amusement and welfare of those now with the colors from their several communities.

"Athletic directors have been appointed for each company and work in baseball, track and football has already commenced, but little can be accomplished until we have the necessary equipment. A football team from the officers of the regiment, organized by the lieutenant colonel, plays the University of Washington on Oct. 13 to raise funds to help purchase this needed equipment for the men, but this money will provide only a small part of the things required.

"Will you not, as mayor, call a meeting of the public-spirited citizens of your city for the purpose of securing contributions of equipment and funds for the soldiers of this regiment? Your clubs and fraternal orders have many members in this organization and should be able to render us valuable assistance. Whenever possible, baseballs, bats, masks, footballs, boxing gloves, uniforms, etc., should be sent direct. Those who have no such articles to spare can render the men of the regiment invaluable assistance by contributing funds for the purchase here of the needed equipment.

"All donations should be sent to the regimental athletic director, Lieut. Harold B. Smith, 32d Infantry, Camp Lewis, Washington.

"The men of this regiment are displaying an indomitable spirit in their duties here and have nothing to be desired. We wish to render their experience in this way as valuable and enjoyable as possible. Athletic sports will do more to render the men contented, to increase their efficiency and to foster clean citizenship among them than any other single factor.

"Will not you and your patriotic citizens help the men of this regiment in the service they are rendering to the country by aiding them in securing the athletic equipment they so badly need?
