ORDINANCE NO. 34

An Ordinance for the annual appropriation for the Town of Ekalaka, Montana, for the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1915.
Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Ekalaka:

Section 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same hereby are appropriated from any available funds of the Town Treasury, not otherwise appropriated derived from collection of taxes, licenses, fines, fees, and miscellaneous sources, for the purpose of operation, maintenance, improvement, repairing and other expenses of the Town of Ekalaka for the fiscal year beginning on the first Monday of May, 1915.

GENERAL FUND

For general municipal and administrative purposes

Salary of City Clerk per annum \$6000

Salary of City Treasurer per annum 2100

Salary of Police Magistrate per annum 2100

Salary of Town Marshal per annum 9000

Salary of City Attorney per annum 1500

General expenses of Elections 1000

Police Department 1000

Board of Health 2500

Fire Department 10000

Total General Fund \$26,980.00

STREET FUND

General maintenance and repair of streets and bridges \$1500

Total Street Fund \$1500

SIDEWALK FUND

General outside name and repair of sidewalks \$750

Section 2. Any appropriation or fund herein provided for may at any time be transferred to any other fund when so provided by ordinance duly enacted by the Town Council for that purpose, but not otherwise.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and repeal.

ORDINANCE NO. 35

An ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 17 of the Town of Ekalaka, relating to the publication of ordinances and providing for the posting of the same in publication.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Ekalaka:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 17 of the Town of Ekalaka, is hereby amended as follows:

"Section 1. Every ordinance shall as soon as practicable after its passage and approved be posted by the Town Clerk on the Town Building Board in front of the Fire Hall and door, and also on three other public and convenient places in said town, and no publication or posting thereof shall be deemed valid unless specifically otherwise provided in the ordinance enacted."

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty days from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance is hereby approved this 20th day of April, 1915.

ORDINANCE NO. 36

An Ordinance relating to the general safety, protection from fire, disease and other injury to the inhabitants of the Town of Ekalaka, and providing for the inspection of all places within the Town of Ekalaka where any agency or condition may exist dangerous or injurious thereto; also providing a penalty for violation of this ordinance.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Ekalaka:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation having in its possession for use, sale, storage or otherwise, any explosive or combustible substance, any flammable or explosive articles, or any article for human consumption unfit for such use, and every person engaged in any business within the Town of Ekalaka, shall at all times maintain therein clean and sanitary conditions, and such conditions generally as will reduce the liability of fire to the lowest possible minimum.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation having in its possession for use, sale, storage or otherwise, any explosive or combustible substance, any flammable or explosive articles, or any article for human consumption unfit for such use, and every person engaged in any business within the Town of Ekalaka, shall at all times conduct the same in an orderly, clean and sanitary manner.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Town Marshal to from time to time inspect all buildings, premises and places referred to in this ordinance for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of the same; and for that purpose he shall be permitted to have access to the same often as may be reasonably necessary thereto.

Section 4. Every person violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in the sum of not less than five dollars or more than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the town jail for the period of not exceeding thirty days, or punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. A judgment that any person pay a fine may also direct that he be imprisoned until the fine be satisfied in the proportion of one day's imprisonment for every two dollars of the fine.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty days from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance is hereby approved the 3rd day of April, 1915.
