Hilstrom Still Holds The Fort

Much of Wednesday was taken up in Justice George Webb's Court, hearing the ejectment proceedings of John S. Evans vs. Mr. Hilstrom, the baker. Mr. Evans has sold the property to Albert Ball, who intended to take it over May 15th, but Hilstrom claims possession because of a two-year lease which he says was given verbally with the understanding that it would be duly made in writing later. Mr. Evans says that Hilstrom was just renting from month to month, with the understanding that the place was to be vacated in the event of a sale. The case was further complicated because of the transfer having been made to Mr. Ball prior to the commencement of the proceedings.

Mr. Evans was given the decision and Mr. Hilstrom has taken an appeal to the District Court, who will not hear the appeal until July. In the meantime Hilstrom holds the fort and Mr. Ball is waiting to commence business in the property, which he owns but does not possess.

Leiter Bros. Recovering Nicely

Ed. Leiter, who was shot three weeks ago, has now completely recovered though yet looking a little peaked and is now again at work in his store. When the hold-up shot him, Leiter was in the act of stepping across the ditch, so that the bullet passed rather sidewise through him not touching the kidney as reported by the doctor.

Ralph Leiter is recovering most satisfactorily from his operation, though he will probably have to remain eight weeks longer in the hospital. In making the operation, two strips of the bone were taken from the lower part of his leg, and grafted into his backbone, thus replacing the parts eaten away by tuberculosis of the spine. The doctors say that he will be as well and strong as any ordinary man when they are through with him.
